OBJECTIVES: To develop collaborative efforts on management issues related to the safe and reliable operation of nuclear power plants.

BACKGROUND: Management is the key to successful achievement of performance objectives in the operation of nuclear power plants (NPPs). This regional project is intended to assist plant superintendents and senior managers to identify and solve problems which, if not adequately addressed, could result in performance shortfalls. The project is designed to exploit the know-how and experience available in the region. It will be implemented through workshops for plant superintendents and senior management from NPPs and nuclear power organizations on managerial practice and specific topics of regional interest in order to identify problem areas and determine measures to solve the problems through regional co-operation. Participants in the workshops will be encouraged to share managerial experiences so that common problems can be identified and solved at a regional level. Bilateral and multilateral expertise will be exchanged, for the benefit of the participating Member States. Visits will be arranged to nuclear sites and utility facilities in the region for in-situ analysis and discussions with the staff.

NATIONAL COMMITMENT: Participating Member States will host the workshops in their respective countries.

AGENCY INPUT: The Agency will organize the workshops and arrange the technical visits to nuclear sites.

IMPACT: Improved management will contribute to the improvement of overall performance in nuclear power plant operation. The development of collaborative efforts will optimize the use and benefits of resources available within the region as well as additional resources provided through Agency and other assistance.
