



American Indian and Alaska Native- Science Leadership Program Energy Resource Development Tribal Internship

Application Deadline: March 15, 2010 • Program Dates: May 25 - July 30, 2010



The Internship

The U.S. Department of Energy's Argonne National Laboratory, a major research center, and the Department of the Interior's Office of Indian Energy and Economic Development are pleased to announce a unique summer internship program for American Indian and Alaska Native college students. Research opportunities will focus on energy resource development, both renewable and non-renewable, and environmental evaluation and analysis of potential

impacts from energy resource development activities. Research projects involve wind energy, solar energy, fuel cells, hydrogen storage, advanced fuels, lithium batteries, environmental and economic systems analysis, production of chemicals from renewable resources, climate change and environmental impact assessments.

Eligibility

American Indian and Alaska Native students must: (a) be currently enrolled as an undergraduate student; (b) be 18 years or older at the start of the program; (c) be a United States citizen; (d) have a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or above out of 4.0; (e) submit Tribal Enrollment documentation and (f) have health insurance.

Expenses and Housing

Round trip transportation, and stipends of \$425 per week are provided to participants. Students will be housed free of charge in an apartment type lodging facility on site and local transportation will be provided.
